


Cruising the Baltic Sea

Day 5 | July 3 B-L

Gdansk, Poland

Spend this morning relaxing on board. This afternoon, choose from two guided tours of Gdansk. On an Old Town walking tour, begin at the Green Gate and stroll along the Motława River to view the iconic Gdansk Crane. Walk the Royal Route to the

magnificent Neptune's
Fountain; the 14th-century
Artus Court, inspired by
Britain's King Arthur; and
St. Mary's Church. Or choose
the Solidarity tour, beginning
at the historic Gdansk
Shipyard, where the Solidarity
Movement — the first
independent trade union in
the Soviet Bloc — began in
1980. Visit the Monument to
the Fallen Shipyard Workers of
1970 and the European
Solidarity Centre.

Day 6 | July 4 B-L-D

Kalmar, Sweden

In Kalmar, one of Sweden's oldest cities, choose one of two excursions. With a guide, visit Kalmar Castle, then take





a walking tour of the Old Town, strolling the cobbled streets and examining ancient city walls and buildings. Or head to Öland, an island known for its unusual limestone plateau, Stora Alvaret, home to a Viking burial ground. Traverse the beach and see lighthouses, a palace and a fishing village on this tour filled with fascinating variety!

Day 7 | July 5

Visby

B-L-D

Disembark for your chosen excursion in Visby, a charming town on Sweden's largest island, Gotland.

This well-preserved medieval town — dating back to the 12th century — is a UNESCO

World Heritage site and is filled with natural beauty and ancient history.
Either take a walking tour of the Old Town and the fascinating Gotlands
Museum, or embark on a guided tour of the medieval sights — admiring the city walls, towers, alleyways and churches.

Day 8 | July 6 Riga, Latvia

Choose your included excursion in this historic city: Tour the UNESCO-inscribed Historic Centre of Riga and beyond, focusing on the vast variety of architectural styles. Or learn of the moving Jewish history of Riga, long a multicultural melting pot.

Visit the former sites of the Great Choral Synagogue and Old Jewish Cemetery, and tour the Museum of Occupation.

Helsinki, the capital of Finland, is also known as "Daughter of the Baltic Sea." Take a panoramic

motorcoach tour of the city's highlights. Pass by the colorful Market Square in the South Harbour and stop to see the modernist Sibelius Monument, an artistic homage to Finland's most famous composer. Visit the subterranean Temppeliaukio Church (if no church services are in progress) called the "Rock Church," as it was impressively hewn into solid natural bedrock.

This afternoon, choose your excursion: visit the charming



village of Porvoo, or indulge in a quintessential restorative Finnish sauna ritual.

Day 11 | July 9

B-L-R-D

Tallinn, Estonia

Tallinn's UNESCO World Heritage-designated Historic Centre has remained virtually unchanged for 600 years. Take in the ancient city walls, and Toompea, the hill on which Tallinn is centered. See the Russian Orthodox Alexander Nevsky Cathedral and Toompea Castle. Continue your walking tour down narrow streets and steep stairs to the Lower

Town. Visit the medieval Tallinn Town Hall, the seat of Estonia's Parliament, and the only surviving Gothic hall in Europe. Bid adieu to your fellow travellers at the Farewell Reception and Dinner this evening.

Day 12 | July 10

Exclusive Guest Speaker | Laura Liswood

Laura Liswood co-founded the Council of Women World Leaders with President Vigdís Finnbogadóttir of Iceland and President Mary Robinson of Ireland, and serves as its Secretary General. The Council is composed of female presidents, prime ministers and heads of government; membership now stands at 90 women, many from the Baltic and Scandinavian regions.

An award-winning speaker, Liswood is the only person to have traveled around the world to meet with all the female heads of state and heads of government. Her interviews are chronicled in her book and video documentary, "Women World Leaders: Great Politicians Tell Their Stories."

Liswood holds an M.B.A. from Harvard Business School and B.A. and J.D. degrees. She is admitted to practice law in California and Massachusetts, and is the author of four books. An adventurous traveller, she has bicycled across Siberia and the Silk Road.


June 25 to 30 (Program Begins: June 26)

July 10 to 12 (Program Ends: July 12)


