








oin us for a special voyage of discovery travelling from Cape Breton to Canadian East Coast island destinations, some only accessible by sea. This intimate yachting experience is designed to bring you comfort and adventure travel without the crowds.

We'll visit many of the East Coast's most scenic points of interests to discover wildlife, fascinating landforms, and vibrant living cultures. From the iconic sand dunes of Sable Island where the famed ponies roam freely to the large bird colonies at Bird Island and the Bald Eagles and resident deer at Anticosti Island, we'll marvel at the variety of marine and land wildlife as we explore on foot and by Zodiac.

We'll delve into many cultural highlights. On Prince Edward Island, we contemplate the history of Confederation. On the rugged Magdalen Islands archipelago, we'll explore Acadian culture. And at St-Pierre and Miquelon, we consider the vestiges of France's once formidable North American territory.

The landscapes and seascapes include some of Eastern Canada's most iconic places; Gaspé's Percé Rock, Newfoundland's famed Gros Morne National Park, and François's spectacular fjord. Our autumn visit coincides with the spectacular fall colours of the Martimes.

Our expedition vessel is the beautiful S/V Klara, a three-mast schooner, purposefully designed and built for expedition cruising. Reminiscent of iconic fishing vessels like Bluenose (a symbol of Nova Scotia), she is a true sailing ship that combines vintage charm with modern amenities. Welcoming a maximum of 36 guests aboard, this recently refurbished vessel provides comfort and a feeling of warmth during our journey.

Detailed Itinerary

Sunday, September 28: Meet in Sydney

We rendez-vous in Sydney, Nova Scotia this evening, Cape Breton's historical capital. Meet our expert team and guests over dinner this evening. Take a stroll on the waterfront to see the world's largest fiddle in recognition of Cape Breton's musical talent!

Overnight: Sydney Meals: Dinner

Monday, September 29: Louisbourg, Embark the Klara

Surrounded by Cape Breton's rocky shoreline, Fortress of Louisbourg National Historic Site brings you back to French colonial life between 1713 and 1758. We'll travel the short drive to Louisbourg to explore the looming fortifications, kitchen gardens, and elegant houses of the reconstruction, then wander original 18th-century ruins for a full experience of the past come to life. Return to Sydney this afternoon to board our expedition vessel, the *S/V Klara*, sailing out of the harbour and into the North Atlantic, heading southward toward the Grand Banks, one of the richest fishing grounds in the world.

Tuesday, September 30: Sable Island

Located on the edge of the Grand Banks, hundreds of kilometres from the coast, Sable Island has a storied history as a graveyard of ships, with more than 350 ships falling victim to the treacherous currents and sandbars. Sporadically inhabited by sealers, shipwreck survivors and salvagers,

the island is now home to fewer than six year-round inhabitants and a herd of Sable Island ponies. Sable Island is now one of Canada's newest national parks.

Wednesday, October 1: Bird Island

Today we sail to the north central coast of Cape Breton to Bird Island, home to a number of important species, including the Great Cormorant, Atlantic Puffin, Atlantic Razorbill, Black-legged Kittiwake, and an important feeding area for Cape Breton's population of Bald Eagles. While the breeding activities on land may have ended by now, we expect to see these species out and about as we explore this area by Zodiac. There are opportunities to launch sea kayaks or enjoy a stand-up paddleboard excursion in the placid waters. On shore, hiking and gentle cycle touring are other activities to enjoy.

Thursday, October 2: Greenwich, Prince Edward Island

This morning, we are anchored off Greenwich on the southeast coast of Prince Edward Island. We have various options. One of them is to enjoy a walking tour of the town, where we can sample the local mussels and friendly atmosphere. History buffs may like to visit the provincial capital of Charlottetown where, in September 1864, representatives from the British Colonies in North America met to discuss Confederation. For others, a visit to Greenwich National Park will be too tempting to resist; its protected, parabolic dunes are a rare phenomenon in North America, and are home to a variety of birds and woodland plants.

Friday, October 3: The Magdalen Islands (Les Îles-dela-Madeleine)

Sculpted out of sandstone, the remote islands of the Gulf of St. Lawrence are home to unique fishing communities with beautifully maintained waterfront houses and boats, flowing grassy plains, and sculpted sandstone shorelines. Europeans first discovered the islands in the mid-15th century, though it is thought that the indigenous Mi'kmaq had been visiting for centuries to hunt Walrus. In addition to the traditional fishing and sealing culture, we will see a wide diversity of bird life along the beaches and lagoons. The island's gentle terrain is also a cyclist's paradise, while the sea kayaking and stand-up paddleboarding through sea arches and into sandstone sea caves are superb. Otherwise, you might enjoy a whale-watching cruise in the Zodiacs or head to the beach to soak up some sun or build sand castles! Overnight: On board

Saturday, October 4: Bonaventure Island and the Gaspé Peninsula

At Bonaventure Island, we drop anchor near the town of Percé and visit the island by Zodiac. One of the largest Northern Gannet colonies in the world, Bonaventure Island is protected under provincial park status in Quebec. We visit the colony, indulging in close-up views of these majestic seabirds! An afternoon visit to the community of Percé will provide a window into the rich fishing culture of French Canada. Zodiac cruising, sea kayaking and stand-up paddleboarding are all activities that can be undertaken here, weather permitting.

Sunday, October 5: Anticosti Island

At the mouth of the St. Lawrence River, where the river water mixes with Arctic waters from the Strait of Belle Isle and the more temperate Atlantic waters, Anticosti Island ("island before the coast") is rich in marine wildlife. We will plan to wander the beaches near the eastern end of the island, followed by a Zodiac cruise along the cliffs at East

Point. We will be keeping our eyes open for shorebirds and seabirds, as well as whales and seals, as we enjoy this region. Bald Eagles may soar along the shoreline, while we may see some of the prolific White-tailed Deer that were introduced to the island. Whales are also a common sight!

Monday, October 6: Gros Morne National Park

Sailing into majestic Bonne Bay, in the heart of Gros Morne National Park, the cliffs soar up out of the water and are covered in a green blanket of tuckamore - windswept spruce sculpted by the ocean breeze. At Woody Point we are welcomed ashore by a delegation from the community before hiking up to the excellent interpretation centre. From there, various guided walks take us into the World Heritage-listed Tablelands and to the lookout for a view over much of the park - a spectacular experience! As options, the twisting mountain road to Trout River makes for a challenging bike ride with our guides, or you can choose to paddle along the shores of Bonne Bay.

Tuesday, October 7: Francois

François (from "François" but pronounced Frans-way per 17th century French pronunciation) is a small, isolated community steeped in the traditions of the sea and perched on the edge of a beautiful fjord on the south coast of Newfoundland. Known as an 'out port' owing to its isolation by land (only accessible by sea or by helicopter), Francois has a deep harbour navigable year-round. When entering the harbour, we will be greeted by one of the few remaining manned lighthouses on the Newfoundland coast. Once past the lighthouse the narrow opening leading into the steepwalled fjord will amaze us! This is a spectacular location and for many, a highlight of the expedition!

Wednesday October 8: St-Pierre and Miquelon

The island of St-Pierre is a European enclave representing the last vestiges of French colonial rule in Eastern Canada. Walking down the streets feels like taking a stroll through a provincial French town. When we depart, you'll be in no doubt you left Canada briefly, and experienced a unique historical phenomenon. There is also an Atlantic puffin colony here, and if the weather permits, we'll take the zodiacs to see these unmistakably maritime birds. Tonight, we enjoy a special dinner, attended by the Captain, to mark the end of our maritime adventure.

Thursday, October 9: Disembark in Sydney

We sail back to Cape Breton across the mouth of the Gulf of St. Lawrence, heading again for Sydney. We will disembark in the morning and while some of us will hustle to the airport, many will add a few extra days in Cape Breton to enjoy one of the gems of Canada's East Coast.

This will be collected at 130 days prior to departure.

Joining Instructions

Weather

Depending on where we are, average daytime highs could be in the range of 5° - 15°C and night-time lows of 0° - 10° C. The weather is also relatively dry with very little rainfall expected. The surface of the ocean typically holds steady at about 10°C, however, and weather may change unexpectedly too, so it's important to dress with warmth and wind protection in mind. Foul weather gear is provided aboard the S/V Klara.



Level of Activity: Easy to Moderate

We have had a very wide range of participants on our expedition voyages ranging from people in their twenties to most in their mideighties. All have had a normal level of fitness that permits them to get in and out of zodiacs, with assistance from expedition staff and sailors, and the ability to walk on pebble beaches and uneven ground. Shore landings usually last for up to three hours at a time, but zodiacs will be available to transport back to the ship at any time. Our Vessel S/V Klara

S/V Klara is a three-mast schooner, specially designed and outfitted for expedition cruising and accommodating 12 crew and up to 36 passengers across 18 cabins on its two decks. She is 62 metres (208 feet) long, travels at a speed of up to 10 knots (18.5 kilometres per hour) and has 220-watt European electrical outlets.

Delicious food is on offer at the restaurant on the Main Deck. An open-air lounge and jacuzzi, as well as ample deck space, are found on the Sun Deck. The Classic and Deluxe cabins each have the following amenities:

- Functioning windows (Upper Deck) or portholes (Main Deck)
- Black-out curtains
- Double bed or twin beds
- Writing desk and chair
- Air-conditioning and private ensuite facilities (with a shower)
- · Flatscreen TV
- · High speed Wi-Fi and sound dock
